Save the Honey Bee!

Imagine a world without honey bees. The Topsfield Fair is pleased to be teaming with Häagen Dazs in their "Save the Honey Bee" efforts.

What can we do to save them? In this session, students will discover what native plant species they can grow to create bee friendly gardens of their own.

Students will see live bee colonies at work, learn how honey is made and the many uses for bees wax. They will also learn about the more than 100 crops that bees are responsible for pollinating.

Scavenger Hunt

The Topsfield Fair has created multiple hunts for different age groups to have the chance to explore the fair.

Which Came First: The Chicken or the Egg?

Students will learn about life cycles as they are able to take a careful look at chickens and their eggs. Students will observe the miracle of chicks hatching as well as, learn about the many different varieties of chickens.

Students will have the chance to walk around our giant show tent and see 20 Eco-Friendly companies and organizations, all of which will have demonstrations and hands on activities for students! Classes will have the chance to see solar panels, rain barrels, composting and much more!

Agricultural Adventure

Groups have the opportunity to tour the fair and all of our buildings with this new program. Each stop has questions and answers about that building, as well as fun murals so students can have their pictures taken.

Cattle Barn - Pet a Calf!

Students are invited to tour our Cattle barn. While there our fair volunteers will show them how a cow is milked and give them a chance to pet a baby calf!
