# **RULES AND REGULATIONS**

- 1. ENTRY FEE IS \$3.00 PER ANIMAL- Maximum sheep per weekend is 300 head. Entries will be received on a first come, first served basis. Entries without an entry fee will not be accepted.
- Management will use care and diligence for safety and health of animals. Neither the Society nor the Committee shall be liable for any loss, injury or damage which may occur. Entries are accepted on these conditions only.
- 3. All animals, except market lambs, must be registered in the name of the exhibitors, and papers must be available for the Committee. All animals must have been owned by exhibitors **30 DAYS BEFORE SHOW**.
- 4. No pending registrations will be accepted; all animals must be EAR TAGGED OR TATTOOED. The sheep committee has the right to temporarily mark any animals that have no identification.
- 5. Animals will be inspected upon arrival for contagious diseases and parasites. Any animal found unhealthy will be removed from the FAIRGROUNDS immediately. All exhibitors MUST HAVE HEALTH PAPERS. Registration papers will be checked upon arrival.
- 6. All animals MUST SHOW SIGNS OF HAVING BEEN FITTED, and market lambs MUST BE SHORN CLEAN.
- 7. Age of animals will be figured as of September 1<sup>st</sup>, Spring Lambs as of January 1<sup>st</sup>.
- 8. Market lambs may be ewes, rams, or wethers and may not be shown in any other class. Market lambs will be weighed Saturday morning before show time at 8:00 a.m.
- 9. Exhibitors are limited to TWO entries in each class.

- 10. All animals in group class must have been shown in individual classes. Group classes are limited to one entry per breed, per exhibitor.
- 11. Sheep should arrive **AFTER** 4:00 p.m. on Thursday, September 28<sup>th</sup>, 2023 and **BEFORE** 10:00 a.m. on Friday, September 29<sup>th</sup>, 2023.
- 12. No sheep are to leave **BEFORE** 6:00 p.m. on Sunday, October 1<sup>st</sup>, 2023.
- 13. No more than two breeds are to be exhibited by one exhibitor.
- 14. Initial bedding will be supplied. Hay, grain and additional bedding will be available for sale on the grounds.
- 15. Exhibitors must inform themselves as to when their BREED OF SHEEP are judged. Sheep must be in the ring promptly on call. A failure to comply with this order renders exhibitor liable to be ruled out of competition.
- 16. NO ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES allowed in the Sheep Barn.
- 17. No unsupervised minors in the barn after closing.
- 18. Proper dress required in show ring at all times.
- 19. Youth are required to wear solid color pants (in good repair) and white shirts in the show ring for Fitting & Showmanship.
- 20. Exhibitors are requested to display their Farm Signs.
- 21. THE SHOW COMMITTEE RESERVES THE RIGHT TO ADD, DELETE OR COMBINE CLASSES AT THEIR DISCRETION.

# **CLASS SP & SPY**

### ADULT CLASS

SP1. ADULT NOVICE- Will be judged on **uniformity of** the yarn.

SP2. ADULT INTERMEDIATE- Will be judged on uniformity of the yarn.

SP3. ADULT ADVANCE- Will be judged on uniformity, texture and creativity of yarn spun.

SP4. DROP SPINDLE- Will be judged on **uniformity of yarn**. QUANTITY SPUN (within reason) IS **NOT** IMPORTANT.

SP5. DROP SPINDLE, LONGEST SPUN- Take 10 minutes to spin as much as you can and then unravel your spindle. The spinner who walks the farthest away from the judge is the winner! You can enter another category along with this one.

### **YOUTH CLASS - Same As Above**

SPY1. YOUTH NOVICE- Will be judged on **uniformity** of the varn.

SPY2. YOUTH INTERMEDIATE- Will be judged on uniformity of the yarn.

SPY3. YOUTH ADVANCE- Will be judged on uniformity, texture and creativity of yarn spun.

SPY4. DROP SPINDLE- Will be judged on **uniformity of yarn.** QUANTITY SPUN (within reason) IS **NOT** IMPORTANT. Plying is at the discretion of the spinner.

SPY5. YOUTH DROP SPINDLE, LONGEST SPUNTake 10 minutes to spin as much as you can and then unravel your spindle. The spinner who walks the farthest away from the judge is the winner! You can enter another category along with this one.

- 1. Entries: All entries should be submitted Thursday, September 28<sup>th</sup>, 2023 between 4:00pm and 9:00pm in the Sheep Barn. All entries can be picked up Tuesday, October 10<sup>th</sup>, 2023 between 4:00pm and 6:00pm.

- 3. All yarns must be hand spun 100% wool fiber, unless otherwise noted. Yarns and Challenge Competitions are limited to one entry per class.
- 4. All items entered should have a tag with Class #, Exhibitor Name, address and phone number. Tags will not be shown in display case.
