ABSOLUTELY NO UNSUPERVISED CHILDREN OR YOUNG ADULTS UNDER AGE 21 YEARS.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. All exhibitors must be between the ages of 5-18 as of January 1, 2025. (5-7 year old's are considered Cloverbuds.)
- 2. Only hornless animals may be shown.
- 3. They may arrive on the fairgrounds between 6:00-9:00pm, Friday, October 10th, 2025, but must arrive before 9:00am, Saturday, October 11th, 2025.

 Animals must remain in place until 5:00pm or until the end of the show, whichever comes later by penalty of premium loss.
- 4. Entry fees MUST accompany entry forms and along with HEALTH CERTIFICATE. Checks made payable to Topsfield Fair, and mailed to: Topsfield Fair, P.O. Box 134, Topsfield, MA 01983, to be received by Friday, October 3rd, 2025.
- 5. ONLINE you must enter classes, pay fees and attach HEALTH CERTIFICATES on or before Friday, October 3rd, 2025. No late entries will be accepted.

6. ABSOLUTELY NO DAY OF SHOW ENTRIES ACCEPTED.

- 7. All animals shown must be owned or leased by exhibitor. Each exhibitor may show no more than 2 animals per class and no more than 8 total. If animals are leased we must have contract copy included with entry forms.
- 8. Classes XYZ are open only to currently enrolled 4-H members and all 3 must be entered.
- 9. Type classes will include purebreds, recorded grades and non-recorded grades that are true to type.
- 10. Any animal suspect of disease will be removed from the area immediately and other animals with it as well and entries forfeited.
- 11. The management will use care and diligence for the safety and health of the animals. The committee is not liable for loss, injury or damage.
- 12. Pens will be supplied for each exhibitor. Fill in entry form with how many goats and pens needed.
- 13. The decision of the judge will be final.
- 14. Classes XYZ will be judged and awarded premiums through 6th place, and/or awarded rosettes, prizes and/or ribbons.
- 15. Herdsmanship will be awarded to the farm, family, Club or exhibitor as described on page 2. \$50 first place, \$25 runner-up. The animals must be cared for entirely by the youth or 4-H'er to qualify for herdsmanship.
- 16. All milk must be removed from grounds by exhibitor or dumped in marked barrels provided only for milk removal.

** Fitting Classes -- animals are to be fit solely by exhibitor (except with clover buds where minimal help is understood) any evidence of foul play will result in disqualification.

Please enclose an entry of \$5.00 per animal to be shown. An exhibitor may enter each specialty division only once. All specialty classes must be pre-entered.

HERDSMANSHIP AWARD

GENERAL QUALIFICATIONS:

- All goat care must be by exhibitor and all decorations put up by exhibitor.
- Goats are safe and well cared for. Stall is generally clean and dry and free of excessive or soft/messy

- droppings. Goats have fresh, clean hay and water at all times.
- Stall is safe at all times, free of debris that the goats can eat or get injured on. Gates should be closed securely and modifications made when necessary to ensure containment of smaller goats. (For example, if you add a piece of chicken wire to the bars, it must be secured in a safe and appropriate way that will not leave sharp edges or long pieces if twine hanging.)
- Goats are transferred to and from the show ring safely with secure collars, are not dragged, are not on long leashes which can be unsafe in crowds. Also, goats should not be brought out of the stall unless they are in a class or about to be. Bringing goats out of the stall to interact with the public is not allowed this year. Goats should not taken out unless in a class or for an approved activity.

ADDITIONAL CRITERIA:

- Decorations, including name plates and farm information, give the stall a welcoming appearance.
 Any decorations must be safely secured and out of reach of goats. All set-up must be done by exhibitor.
- Appearance and cleanliness of the tack stall:
 Equipment in tack stall should be clean and well
 organized. (For example, if you have clippers, they
 should not have wires hanging across the stall, all hair
 should be swept up, and cups for cleaning hooves
 should be gathered up and put out of sight. If you are
 milking, buckets should be rinsed out and stand
 wiped down, any grain or treats swept up.)
- Interaction with the public: People will want to pet your goats and ask questions. It is important to engage with the public and answer their questions. (This year will be different because animals will not be allowed to come out of stalls for petting, holding, or pictures.)
