PLEASE BRING PRODUCE FOR SECTION E TO THE VEGETABLE BUILDING BETWEEN 7:00PM AND 9:00PM ON WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 1ST, 2025. PLEASE BRING PRODUCE FOR ALL OTHER SECTIONS TO THE VEGETABLE BUILDING BETWEEN 5:00PM AND 9:00PM ON THURSDAY, OCTOBER 2ND, 2025. THE BUIDLING WILL BE CLOSED AT 10:00 P.M. ALL DISPLAYS MUST BE COMPLETED BY THIS TIME.
- 2. All vegetables must be grown, selected and arranged by exhibitors and entered in proper class.
- 3. Exhibitors should select specimens uniform in size, shape and color, true to type, and of prime table quality (free of rot), washed when necessary.

- 4. Leave only about one inch of top on plate exhibits of beets, carrots, parsnips, onions, radishes, etc.
- 5. A desk for making entries with a member of the committee in attendance will be found in the vegetable building for your convenience.
- 6. No exhibit will be entitled to a prize or other award unless it possesses points of superiority; and no award will be made to unworthy objects, though they may be the only ones of their kind of exhibition.
- 7. No exhibitor may exhibit more than one entry of the same variety in any class.
- 8. Special classes will be arranged for any recognized vegetable of merit if there are three entries, or at the discretion of the committee.
- 9. The correct variety name must be entered with all vegetables to receive prizes.
- 10. BUILDING WILL BE LOCKED UNTIL 3:00 PM ON TUESDAY, OCTOBER 14th, 2025. EXHIBITS MUST BE PICKED BY BETWEEN 3:00-5:30 PM ON TUESDAY, OCTOBER 14th, 2025 or they will be donated to a local food pantry.
